
# **Program Updates: Scholarships**

# **Program Updates: Mini Grants**




Photo of students doing TALL lab as part of the projectile motion project at MVRHS.

FOM is pleased to offer a mini-grant program that supports, encourages, and facilitates great teaching ideas that would not be possible within the existing school budget. During 2018, FOM awarded \$8,037.03 in mini-grants for a eight projects throughout the district. Mini-grant projects in 2018 included:

- Problem Solving at EVS
- Place-based Ecology Education Outdoor Classroom at IRS and MVRHS
- HOBO Data Logging at MVRHS
- Projectile Motion Project at MVRHS
- Keyboards for Chorus at CES and EVS
- Side Tables with Gary Wood at MVRHS
- NYC Fashion Trip at MVRHS
- Farm-to-School Project at CES

In total, FOM has awarded over \$20,000 in mini-grant funds.





# Program Updates: Friends Feeding Friends

Friends Feeding Friends continued to grow in 2018 and we are grateful for the ongoing community support. During 2018 we celebrated our second anniversary and had 281 households who made 1,934 visits to our pantries. Friends Feeding Friends also brought 138,632 lbs of food into the district for distribution. Below are some highlights from our year.

#### **Pantries**

We have two public community food pantries serving Canaan, Dorchester, Enfield, Grafton and Orange. The Enfield pantry is in the Enfield town office and the Canaan pantry is in the MTD Building Contractors building (behind Canaan Hardware).

Both pantries are open once a week and staffed with two volunteers. The pantries provide a three day supply of food that includes meat, dairy, produce, breads, and non-perishables. We also have a variety of personal care and household items. Shoppers may come weekly and only need to show proof of residency on the first visit.

#### **Volunteers**

Perhaps the most important part of this program is our volunteers. Tuesday is our usual day for deliveries and there is never a week without help from volunteers within the community. Our pantry manager, Lana Evans and Carolyn Cusick, program manager, lead the charge unpacking and sorting orders and donations. We also have a prep crew, headed by Cara Drexler, Nancy Smith, Edie Bellion, Annette Hutchins, Dan Moore, George Lazarus, and John Boucher who show up most every delivery to sort perishables. This year our Chief Food Transporters are Dan Kiley, Sharon Kiley, Bob Cusick, Sherman Hallock, and Alan Ricard. The pantries are staffed each week by volunteers. Please consider being part of our team.

#### **School Collaboration**

Each school has a food representative that assists with the effort to increase food security and food access for all students. FOM strives to supply our four school buildings with snacks for students without the resources to bring snacks to school. We have a special designated snack room that school food representatives may access to get the snacks they

need for their school. MVRHS has its own non-public pantry that also services the Indian River School. FOM is the chief supplier for this pantry and we try our best to supply healthy options including food for weekend backpacks. District employees shared feedback that having healthy snacks available helps students stay focused in class and we are happy to be of help!

#### **Partners**

FOM remains an agent of the New Hampshire Food Bank (NHFB), which allows us to stretch funds further. In 2018 we got 125,041 lbs from the NHFB at an average price of \$0.04/lb. Our partnership with the NHFB is the foundation of our Friends Feeding Friends program and the following partners help make the program even stronger:

Mascoma High School and Indian River Helping Hands worked with FOM to help fill 85 boxes of food for school families during school breaks. In 2018 we supplied 85 turkeys for the holidays, in addition to other food.

Mascoma Valley Firefighters organize a toy and food drive and distribution each December for school district families. In 2018 we were happy to help supply food for 100 boxes.

Price Chopper and Shaw's of West Lebanon are part of the NHFB's Fresh Rescue program, and we gratefully pick up food every week. This program enables us to provide high quality frozen meats to our shoppers.

Willing Hands provides fresh produce and breads to our pantries each week. In 2018 they donated 5,591 lbs of food to FOM.

**Tri-County CAP** provides commodities to our pantries. Volunteers travel to Plymouth to pick them up and bring them to the pantry for sorting and stocking. FOM received 8,000 lbs in 2018!

Cardigan Mountain School and FOM continued building our partnership in 2018. Most Sunday mornings, a staff member brings a group of volunteer students to help unpack and sort pantry items. The students held a Pennies War again in 2018 and raised \$1,786.79 for FOM!

Mascoma Valley Ecumenical Council provides
Thanksgiving food boxes to community families. FOM
was honored to provide 60 turkeys for the boxes in
2018. Thank you for donating leftover food to the
pantries!

Upper Valley Humane Society (UVHS) started to send their mobile food pantry to our Canaan pantry site to distribute bags of dry dog and cat food. Both of our pantries keep a supply of pet food and the UVHS has a food pantry on their site in Enfield. They realize that transportation may be an issue with our Mascoma Valley pet owners and they are extending a helping hand.
